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Description	<p>This short three-month course equips international general dentists with the clinical knowledge and skills necessary to diagnose and initiate treatment of common malocclusions that can be treated with removable appliances. The program includes theoretical discussions, appliance demonstrations, biomechanics of tooth movement, and supervised clinical training.</p>

<p>Complete Description</p>	<p>At the end of this course, participants are expected to be able to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Perform orthodontic examination and diagnosis of patients with Class I, II, III malocclusions, open bite, deep bite, and arch expansion needs. 2. Explain the advantages, disadvantages, and indications for the use of removable orthodontic appliances. 3. Understand the biomechanics of tooth movement achievable with removable appliances. 4. Select the appropriate appliance and describe its design and components. 5. Deliver removable appliances and perform follow-up treatment under supervision. 6. Resolve common problems and identify treatment limitations.
